SBNH Launches New Preschool Program for the Fall 2012!

A long wished for dream has finally come true at the Neighbourhood House. In September we will open the doors of our brand new preschool program for children 3-5 years old. As we have grown in the community we have continued to respond to identified needs.

Over the years, we have received many requests for preschool programming. Families participating in our Family Place drop-in programs have often stated that a quality Preschool would be a perfect follow-up to participation in the drop in.

The new South Burnaby Neighbourhood House preschool programs are designed to meet the varying needs of children and families in a diverse community. The program is play-based and will reflect the cultural backgrounds and

languages of the children enrolled in the program. We will support the potential of children in all areas: social and emotional development and opportunities for both intellectual and physical development. Each day will include a variety of activities, such as arts and crafts, music, drama, indoor and outdoor play, community outings (walks, Library trips etc....) and plenty of time for free play.

There is also an exciting opportunity for parents who wish their children to be introduced to a second language. Polish semi-immersion will be available in some classes.

The program will include songs, crafts and circle time activities in Polish led by a native speaker.

The Community Adult Literacy Program (CALP) comes to Burnaby

An exciting new program funded by the Ministry of Advanced Education is now available at South Burnaby Neighbourhood House. The CALP matches English speaking adults who face challenges in their reading and writing skills with trained tutors one-on-one to support them in their learning.

This free program is the first of its kind to be offered in Burnaby in partnership with the Burnaby Public Library, Douglas College and Literacy Now Burnaby. Twenty volunteer tutors were trained by staff of Douglas College to be able to create a personal learning program for their potential learners. By the end of the training in March this year, 15 of our tutors were ready to be matched with learners and begin tutoring sessions.

Tutoring sessions take place once a week for 2 hour sessions where learners acquire basic reading and writing skills and with this support, reach their personal goals. The BPL maintains an excellent collection of Literacy titles and is generous enough to offer their quiet spaces to our tutors for their meetings.

The CALP is an excellent program where tutors get an opportunity to give back to the community and learners learn at their pace and improve their literacy skills in order to be more able to achieve their goals.

Storefront Drop-in

Kids Out of the Rain

The "Kids Out of the Rain" Program is an alternative program for students in grade 2 to 5. The program includes recreational activities for children through which they will be encouraged to interact with other students in the school. The program is running at Maywood Community School throughout the school year.

Homework Club

Homework Club is a program offered for children, grades 4 to 7, who experience barriers to academic success. The program will work with young people to support their academic performance by providing a safe and caring environment for them to learn and grow. The program is running at Stride Community School throug hout the school year.

Friendship Club

Friendship Club is a program offered for children, grades 4 to 7. The focus of the program is on providing a safe and caring environment for the participants to engage in social and recreational activities. The program is running at Edmonds Community School and Douglas Rd Elementary School throughout the school year.

Youth Leadership

We offer 3 levels of Youth Leadership Program:

- Foundations in Leadership- A leadership program designed for younger youth in grades 8 and 9. On-going registration is available for this program.
- Leadership 1- A community leadership training program developed for local high school youth that focuses on skill development working with children. Leadership 1 is offered September to April and January to August each year.
- Leadership 2- The focus of this level is on being a *change agent* within the community by project planning and fundraising for the immediate and long-term needs of the community. Leadership 2 starts October and runs through to May each year.

Appointments are required and can be made by calling the UBC Law Students' Legal Advice Program at 604-822-5791 ext. 0. The students are supervised by a practicing lawyer and are able to assist low income indi-

viduals with legal matters such as minor criminal

offences, small claims, landlord/tenant disputes and basic wills/estates.

Income Tax Clinic

Volunteers are available year-round to assist individuals with their income tax returns. Service is offered to those with limited income and we request a \$5 don ation per return.
