Diversity: The Changing Face of our Community By Kimberly Barwich

Burnaby is one of the most diverse communities in the lower mainland. We have the benefit in our community to be surrounded by variety of ethnicities and countries of origin; of ages and abilities; of orientations and culture - all of which bring a richness of experience to Burnaby. With difference, however, can sometimes come misunderstanding and from misunderstanding, conflict. Much is required from all who live here to broaden their understanding, awareness and openness to make Burnaby a welcoming and inclusive community.

South Burnaby Neighbourhood House, through exciting initiatives such as Diversity Training, Anti-racism arts initiative and BWIN (Building Welcoming and Inclusive Neighbourhoods) is working together with neighbours to address these issues and make Burnaby the best possible place to live and work.

As part of a broader Burnaby Intercultural Planning Table (BIPT) project funded by provincial government, community members are being trained to lead diversity workshops for fellow residents. Youth, newcomers and long-term residents will participate in train the trainer sessions and prepare to lead workshops in community venues such as seniors centers, youth centers, daycares, or PAC committees. The same format is being applied to seniors and with the support of New Horizons funding, SBNH will also train a team of seniors as diversity workshop facilitators. These presentations will broaden community members' understanding of

Burnaby's Diversity and give participants a new perspective on their neighbourhood. In the spring, SBNH hosted two community gatherings (also funded by the provincial government and in partnership with the (BIPT) that brought together a diverse group of people to participate in an arts-based exploration of diversity and racism. Through music, drama, drawing and story telling, people shared their understanding of communities without racism. After these events, a small group of residents gathered to use this information to create an idea for an anti-racism mural. Watch the Marlborough Daycare building for this exciting mural to begin taking shape in late June and the launch of the mural scheduled at a summer barbeque on July 25th.


The BWIN project has been very successful in providing opportunities for long term residents and immigrants to work together on committees and provide programs and events that welcome everyone. This has included volunteer opportunities, sharing of culture dinners, summer barbeques and newcomer dinners. Through the combined efforts of these projects and the promotion of community engagement, SBNH is successfully creating intercultural bridges for a healthy community while creating a sense of belonging for all our neighbours. ESL Classes:

Mondays and Thursdays from 1-3 pm. Volunteer-led ESL classes are available throughout the year for beginner students.

Free Law Clinics: Tuesdays 12:15pm - 2:15pm
Provided to individuals who cannot access help
from Legal Aid and who are low income and cannot
afford a lawyer. Half hour appointments can be
booked with a qualified volunteer lawyer who will
provide step by step advice for dispute resolution.
Lawyers do not appear in court, but can assist
clients in court preparation. Call 604-878-7400 to
book an appointment. Provided in partnership with
the Western Canada Society to Access Justice.

Free Legal Advice Program

Appointments are required and can be made by calling the UBC Law Students' Legal Advice Program at 604-822-5791 ext. 0.

The students are supervised by a practicing lawyer and are able to assist low income individuals with legal matters such as minor criminal offences, small claims, landlord/tenant disputes and basic wills/ estates.

Income Tax Clinic

Volunteers are available year-round to assist individuals with their income tax returns. Service is offered to those with limited income and we request a \$5 donation per return.
