International Neighbourhood House Youth Worker Exchange in Berlin By Marleen Eberding

Who doesn't dream of going to Europe during summer? This summer I got to do exactly that- as a part of my work! Barely back at office, I sit here and reflect on the incredible experience that I had the privilege of participating in.

In the last week of August, Youth Workers from New York, Minneapolis, Toronto, Vancouver and Berlin met together at the UfaFabrik Neighbourhood Center in Berlin Germany-for a week of sharing best practices, struggles and accomplishments. Over the course of the week we had the opportunity to learn from each other and about how each country, more specifically each city does Youth Work.

We presented workshops to each other, and shared our unique techniques and approaches to empower youth. Some connect to youth through theater programs, others through transition to work or university preparation programs. Life skill development and education for new comer youth was another common theme. Some programs provide essential life saving programs for youth, such as a youth-run-hotlines providing access to shelters for inner city youth needing protection from the cold streets.

Each workshop had its own unique desired outcome, but conversations would be inspired and would continue throughout the day. The four of us from the Vancouver area would find ourselves late at night continuing the conversations and discussing the systemic realities of oppression and racism that are faced by the youth that we work with. We shared stories and shed tears, realizing how important these realities are to the work that we do.

Our jam packed schedule took us from workshops to excursions. We visited many youth centers, family centres, & community gardens, where an emphasis was on green space and sustainability was very evident. After visiting a number of community gardens locations, it was difficult not to notice the

In a desire to create extra income some of the community gardens had small restaurants, while others had animal farms for children and families to use as a class room area; these included bee hive area, and a bug garden. Other highlights of "green" things were the unique gardening techniques from a hot house built from an old RV where seedlings were grown, rain-water systems, recycled material, a public washroom built from old container boxes. a medicine garden area & a mini book store.



All members of the community were welcome to support and use the gardens as a recreational area, so on any given day you would see families and friends gather at picnic tables or individuals just hanging out in the hammocks. But that if that's not enough...you could also buy the vegetables that are grown in these gardens! Other excursions took us to theater programs, child care facilities, youth centres with recording studios, and to important historical educational tours of German parliament and government buildings.

Being in a city such as Berlin, with so much history, and seeing it's ability to show such incredible resiliency, was a testament of the capacity for humanity's ability to overcome and be adaptable. It is also a reminder that we need each other, and that community development and social service work like what SBNH does- is key to bridging, assisting in healing, and creating a sense of community. This is happening throughout Neighbourhood Houses and youth programs all over the world- all with the same common goal.

Across the board, you could feel the heart of these 40 youth workers. Each of these people, in their own way, is trying to enrich the lives of the youth they work with. Youth in each neighbourhood are unique. To share different ideas with each other as people working with these youth, we are able to take away each others energy so that we can implement new techniques back in our home countries. I love to travel, but traveling also makes you appreciate home. I am happy to be home. Thank you SBNH for this opportunity!

ESL Classes

Free Legal Advice Program

Appointments are required and can be made by calling the UBC Law Students' Legal Advice Program at 604-822-5791 ext. 0. The students are supervised by a practicing lawyer and are able to assist low income individuals with legal matters such as minor criminal offences, small claims, landlord/tenant disputes and basic wills/estates.

Income Tax Clinic

Volunteers are available year-round to assist individuals with their income tax returns. Service is offered to those with limited income and we request a \$5 donation per return.
