- Informal Interview (10 minutes interview). Book a time and day to meet with Janice (either North or South House) <u>janiceh@burnabynh.ca</u> or with Shelly – South House (<u>volunteer@burnabynh.ca</u>).
- Cleared criminal check. This is a free check for volunteers; a form will be given to applicants.
- 4. Reference check (from a friend, neighbour, classmate, or colleague)
- 5. Volunteer orientation (1 hour). Contact Janice or Shelly to find out the next Volunteer orientation dates.
- 6. Signed understanding of policies and procedures (completed at the orientation).
- 7. A photo for your volunteer file.
- 8. Additional training for some programs (Office, Translation, Taxes, Multilingual, Marketing, or working with kids).
- 9. Immunization record/or signed waiver (Childcare or Preschool programs).

Neighbourhood Outreach

Family Outreach workers are available to support parents with children up to 12 years old who need help meeting other parents and making community connections. We can help parents with finding resources for themselves and their children.

Youth Leadership

We offer three levels of Leadership, each with a different community focus. All programs have components of problem solving, social interaction, communication, group work as well as individual initiative. (Subsidies available)

Foundations of Leadership: Youth in grades 8-9

The focus is on gaining a stronger sense of appreciation and belonging for the community. This is done through various volunteering opportunities, learning sessions and some out-trips. (Subsidies available) **Volunteer Hours:** 120 (incl. summer), Wednesdays 3:45pm - 6:00pm.

Leadership 1: Grades 10 & 11

This group offers youth the skills to work with children in recreational settings; planning games and activities for kids and being strong mentors. Youth are trained and then volunteer in our School Aged Child Care licensed facilities. This program is also a way for youth to complete the required Career Preparations hours for High School graduation. **Volunteer Hours:** 90 Tuesdays 4:00pm - 6:00 pm.

Leadership 2: Youth in grades 11-12

Leadership 2 emphasizes leadership through one of: fundraising, mentorship of Grade 7's by the youth volunteers or event planning & facilitation. Youth will also gain leadership and employment readiness skills which will be beneficial to many areas of their futures such as post-secondary/scholarship applications and job placement. **Volunteer Hours:** 60, Mondays 4:00 - 6:00pm.

Youth Employment Program

We offer a free 20-week program for unemployed youth ages 15 - 30. 8 weeks in-class + 12 weeks work placement. We provide support in career planning, employment counselling, job search strategies, certificates and training. To qualify for this program, you must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person legally eligible to work in Canada and not participating in another federally funded job program.
