This 12-week youth leadership development and volunteer program offers youth the opportunity to learn new skills and work with children in recreational settings, community events and other Burnaby Neighbourhood House Programming. Through a variety of workshops, activities and certification training, we aim to help instill the confidence and skills needed to be the leaders of their community!

Volunteer Hours: 80

Three Sessions: 12 weeks

Mar - Jun / Sept - Nov / Dec - Mar

Training can vary depending on the season but generally the trainings are

Tuesdays from 3:45-6:00pm

~24 hours of training

Youth must also complete 24hrs of Leadership Development training
