

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY Early Years Outreach Worker – Part-Time

The Burnaby Neighbourhood House is a volunteer-driven, community-based social service agency that provides programs and services in response to identified community needs. The Early Years Outreach Worker, in co-operation with local inter-agencies in Burnaby, will find and support isolated families with children in the 0-12 year range in identified high need areas. They will provide families with community information and referrals, while also encouraging and facilitating their participation in existing community programs. A strong focus of this position will be on, but not limited to, supporting newcomer families. This part time position will be a combination remote and in office work with the focus on participants in the South Burnaby area.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

- Promote programs and services within Burnaby as well as within the Burnaby Neighbourhood House.
- Work within and promote the values and vision of the Burnaby Neighbourhood House.
- Work with and support families to access programs and services to meet basic needs. Ie. Social assistance, housing, food, parenting support etc.
- Work closely with schools, health department, multicultural organizations, MCFD, other existing community services to receive and act on referrals.
- Invite parents and their children to participate in community programs and events and to be available to meet and welcome them within the existing family resource programs.
- Work with Burnaby interagency members to maintain and update information of available community resources and services.
- Gather statistical information on contacts made and to prepare and submit progress reports on a regular basis.
- Identify and report on gaps in services in identified areas.

Qualifications:

- Degree or diploma in a social service related field or equivalent work experience.
- Strong English language skills, including written and verbal communication skills. Second language is an asset.
- Knowledge and experience with the five domains of Early Childhood Development.
- Knowledge of the Burnaby community and its services (an asset).
- Knowledge and awareness of issues surrounding diversity and multiculturalism.
- Ability to problem-solve and manage change and uncertainty
- Ability to be flexible and adaptable in the workplace.
- Ability to work independently as well as work comfortably in a team centered environment.
- Intermediate computer literacy skills with Microsoft office and social media platforms.
- Driver's license and access to a vehicle is required.
- Current 1st Aid and CPR certification.
