Summer Camp Program Leader (Burnaby)

The Burnaby Neighbourhood House is a volunteer driven community based social service agency that provides a wide range of programs and services in response to identified community needs.

This position requires positive, energetic people who are a high school student returning to high school or full-time university/college in September. Program leaders are responsible for implementing Daycamp activities with the team leaders. Under the direction of the team leaders, the program leaders will also be responsible for supervising 10 children and provide a safe and welcoming atmosphere for participants. Program leaders will have the opportunity to work with all ages and different team leaders throughout the summer.

General Duties and Responsibilities:

- Promotes Neighbourhood House program integration philosophy by ensuring programs have the opportunities to interconnect and achieve client integration across program areas.
- to assist the supervisor in planning and implementing a summer program for ages 6-12
- to supervise participants on weekly out trips
- to assist the supervisor in planning theme days
- to work within budget limits
- to work with volunteers
- to talk with parents/caregivers on a regular basis
- to ensure participants are involved in a safe summer program
- to ask and receive feedback from Senior leaders
- to assist in the end of the summer day camp clean up
